Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E)

This measure evaluates members 19 years of age and older who are up to date on recommended routine vaccines for influenza, tetanus and diphtheria (Td) or tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis (Tdap), zoster, pneumococcal, hepatitis B, and COVID-19.

Did You Know?

- Adult vaccination rates are extremely low.
- Most adults lack awareness regarding their vaccination requirements.
- The strongest indicator of whether patients receive vaccinations is a recommendation from their healthcare provider.
- Numerous vaccination opportunities are missed in adults when healthcare providers do not routinely assess vaccination status.

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How Can Providers Help?

- Conduct regular vaccination assessments during routine check-ups or appointments.
 - Each vaccination has a specific age range and time period for which they must be completed.
- Provide education and information about the importance and benefits of adult immunizations.
- Offer convenient access to vaccination services, including on-site vaccinations or referrals to nearby clinics.
- Utilize reminder systems, such as phone calls, text messages, or patient portals to prompt patients about upcoming or overdue vaccinations.
- Address concerns or misconceptions about vaccines through open communication and personalized discussions with patients.
